



Purchasing oral syringes



The NHS Commissioning Board Special Health Authority advises healthcare organisations on how the design of medical devices, and the methods used to measure and administer oral liquid medicines, can improve patient safety.

We've summarised the key considerations every pharmacy should keep in mind when purchasing syringes to ensure patients, particularly babies and young children, have the right syringe for administering oral medicines safely and correctly:

- Oral / enteral syringes, with purple coloured plungers or syringe barrels, helps to differentiate them from intravenous syringes Check the design
- As a minimum, a 1ml, 5ml or 10ml syringe should be supplied depending on the dose prescribed Ensure recommended sizes are offered
- Oral liquid medicines are often administered to babies, young children and adults who have impaired ability to swallow tablets and capsules. Oral syringe graduations are vital to ensure accurate dosing **Graduations** are a must

How to use Precision® syringes

- Wash your hands thoroughly with soap and water
 - Ensure a clean and hygienic environment before administering medicines
- Shake the medicine bottle prior to opening
 - Medicines should be gently shaken before use to ensure all particles are properly dispersed in the solution
- Insert bottle adapter or bung to the medicine bottle (if required)
 - To make dispensing easier and ensure accurate dosing, make sure you use the correct syringe adapter
- Draw up the required dose of medicine from the bottle using the oral syringe
 - The syringe tip should be securely inserted into the bung to avoid leaks when tilting bottle to fill syringe











- Place the tip of the oral syringe into the side of your child's mouth
 - Make sure that your child is sitting up or standing before inserting the syringe
- Ask your child to close their lips around the tip of the oral syringe
 - It's important that your child is prepared to take the medicine to ensure the full dosage is administered
- Slowly push the plunger to squirt small amounts of the liquid into your child's mouth
 - Always ensure to aim the tip of the syringe into the space between your child's gum and cheek
- Allow your child to swallow before pushing the plunger again
 - Do not push the plunger too quickly or squirt all the liquid at once as this may cause your child to choke
- Give your child a drink to wash down the liquid medicine
 - To hide the taste, offer your child a drink of milk or fruit juice straight after giving the medicine











After-care for Precision® syringes



Straight after using a syringe, you should wash it well with soapy water. Draw the plunger in and out in the soapy water several times, then rinse the syringe in clean water in the same way.

Rinse well

All Precision® syringes are 100% reusable and dishwasher-safe, so can be completely sterilised without compromising on quality. **Sterilise in dishwasher**

If the medicine bottle has a rubber bung you can usually keep it in the bottle all the time. Wipe the top of the bung with a damp paper towel after each dose and put the cap on between doses.

Some bungs need to be removed from the bottle, and washed before and after each use. Your pharmacist will advise you about this.

Remember, you should never use a syringe if the graduation markings have rubbed off. This could be very dangerous for your child. **Ensure** graduations are clearly marked

Return these to your pharmacy and request Precision® branded syringes as markings won't rub off.
